The picture shows League members joining the 'topping out' ceremony where hospital officials and contractors gathered to celebrate this key milestone in the construction of the CCU.


Sir Richard Ibbotson, Chairman of the Trust thanked the League for taking the lead in funding the purchase of some of the sophisticated kit for the unit. Significantly, he said that it was 90 years ago, almost to the day that Ella Rowcroft laid the first brick in the building of the hospital, which made today's achievement so special. He went on to say that this building was a concrete demonstration of the Trusts intention for the delivery of specialised care to patients.

He said the existing 10 bed CCU was 30 years old so that what was being built now was a stunning change and great opportunity for improvement. The increase to 14 beds may not seem much but he said that it represented a high point in the development of critical care.

Above all he said the new unit would require some sophisticated kit and he was delighted that the League of Friends had taken the lead in funding this. The final "topping out", was then undertaken by our president Patricia Roberts, with some help from the official party.

Patricia welded the final piece of roofing felt to symbolize the completion of the erection of this building.





This is Critical...

It has taken just two years for our ambitious 'This is Critical' campaign to reach £1.6million for the Hospital's new Critical Care Unit (CCU)

It's a tremendous achievement made only thanks to the enormous commitment of the League's volunteers, together with very generous support from the population of Torbay and South Devon.

The hospital has invested £15m into the overall CCU project but the League's donation will help to equip this new unit and provide patients with the best possible care.

The League's CCU 'shopping list' comprised 28 pumps, an ultrasound machine. 2 Heamofiltration machines, 14 hi-tech beds including 4 bariatric beds, 14 Ventilators, 14 Patient monitors and pendants for mounting and a central monitoring unit.

During its 62 year history, including the 'This is Critical' appeal, the League has now raised an incredible £16.805.595

A key step in reaching the target for the CCU campaign was a fantastic contribution of £300,000 from the Paignton Hospital League of Friends, recognising that the new CCU will benefit patients from across the wider South Devon NHS area and showing the commitment and enthusiasm of the incredible network of Hospital Leagues.

Young Mum says a Thousand Thanks to League of Friends.

A young Mum whose daughter nearly died in Torbay Hospital's critical care unit has said a thousand thank-yous for saving her life.

Lynsey Romeo's daughter Mia, now aged 4, was admitted to the hospital's Louisa Cary children's ward when she was just 10 weeks old. She was diagnosed with broncolitous and within hours was transferred to the intensive care unit. She was then treated at Bristol Children's Hospital where she underwent several operations including two heart surgeries.

'I really believe that if it wasn't for the care she received in the ICU, Mia wouldn't be with us today. She has been taken to intensive care several times during her young life and the care she received there has always been outstanding. As well as being so professional and skilful, the staff managed to be very comforting and reassuring to me a distraught mother.'

She added: 'I couldn't thank them enough and the only thing I could think of was to raise money for the unit. I managed to organise a fund raising event at PGL Barton Hall where my mother has worked for eight seasons. One of the team members, Iain, hosted the event and local businesses were incredibly generous with donated prizes. It was a fantastic evening and we managed to raise £1,228'

Two benches funded by the League of Friends for Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAHMS)

June 2016 Cheryl Hoole, Practice Manager from CAMHS met with us to make a bid for the funding of a replacement bench in the garden of the Annexe. The original bench, also funded by the League, had become in poor repair and was no longer safe. The cost was £83.99. As this price was extremely competitive and time sensitive the Committee unanimously agreed to fund two benches and asked Cheryl to buy another plague to go on the second bench.

Cheryl said "We are very grateful to the League of Friends for providing the money for these benches. They provide a small but amazingly positive addition to the garden, helping to sustain staff well-being and giving young people and their parents a way of accessing the garden to rest and take time out from what, sometimes, were distressing situations."



Lynsey, who is pictured with Mia, along with her sister Danielle and niece Bonnie, said:

'All the money in the world couldn't thank these wonderful people for what they did for me and Mia, so this is just a little thank you from us'.

League of Friends chairman Peter Welch, who is pictured receiving Mia's cheque said: 'This is a wonderful gesture and so typical of the sort of stories we hear every day. Torbay Hospital is a great place filled with hard-working and dedicated staff, and we are privileged to be their main charity fund-raiser.'

The cash will go towards the League's £1.6 million 'This Is Critical campaign to raise money to equip the hospital's new Critical Care Unit.

News from the Hospital...

- We have formed stronger partnerships with our local voluntary sector, we are now working with two 'umbrella' partnerships in South Devon and Torbay and we have funded them to employ our 12 new Well-being Co-ordinators who will work in each of our localities.
- We are investing £5 million in local community services, including recruiting 66 additional staff to enhance our intermediate care service. As well as these additional staff we now also have GPs and pharmacists as part of our integrated teams.
- Our new self-referral physiotherapy service is helping people manage their hip and knee conditions and has reduced the need for surgical intervention.
- We have introduced a new way for GPs to get direct advice from our hospital consultants about their patients without the need for a hospital appointment. Now only those people who really need to come to hospital are referred.
- We are improving the Minor Injuries
 Service and establishing the new Health
 and Well-being Team who work closely
 with local GPs. Torquay is our other early
 implementer site and we will be rolling
 our these changes to our other three
 localities depending on the decisions
 from the current public consultation.
- In February, we had our first full CQC inspection, and inspectors were impressed by the compassion, care and innovation they saw right across our services, with many rated as good or outstanding. They also saw the huge pressure our system was under and the impact this had on people needing emergency and urgent care. The CQC rating of 'requires improvement' matched our own assessment, and the changes staff are making right across the Trust are making a real difference.



Mairead McAlinden, Chief Executive of Torbay and South Devon NHS Foundation Trust, said:

"I wanted to take this opportunity to thank the League of Friends, for the valuable work they do to support our staff to provide the best possible health and social care for the people of Torbay and South Devon, from the friendliness they experience when using the Butterflies Café to the comforts that the Linen League provide. Your work on our wards and departments contributed to our CQC rating as 'outstanding' for caring.

The new CCU and main entrance project is progressing really well, with the building now being fully watertight and the external cladding to the main façade completed.

In October the installation of the "Brise-soleil" started – this is an architectural feature which deflects sunlight, thus reducing heat gain and improving the building's energy efficiency.

On 1 October 2015, after almost two years of planning, we became Torbay and South Devon Foundation Trust, and it marked the next stage in our journey of truly integrated hospital and community care for local people. In the midst of so much change, it is easy to lose sight of how far we have already come, so I'd like to tell you about some of the successes of the last year.

None of these achievements would have been possible without the commitment of our staff and the support of our partners.

The League of Friends is our partner in care, and on behalf of all our staff I sincerely thank you for everything you do to support Torbay Hospital and the patients we care for.
