# COVID-19

#### COVID-19 is circulating in the community again and has affected residents and staff in and around the Torbay area.

Therefore, we'd like to reassure residents. relatives and staff that we are supporting the hospital to ensure the safety of residents and protect staff.

A comprehensive action plan has been enacted to keep families informed, contain the virus and continue giving the best care

The Trust is working closely with Public Health England, Torbay Council, Public Health England and NHS Devon Clinical Commissioning Group to support all our colleagues.

#### Remember 'Hands, Face, Space':

- + Everyone is reminded of the importance of social distancing to prevent the spread of the virus.
- + Good hygiene is the best prevention to protect you and your family by washing hands regularly and thoroughly
- + Covering mouths when coughing

Our AGM in May was postponed due to Covid. We monitored the situation as the lockdown was eased and it was decided to organise it for October. The Prime Minister has decided now that there should be a "rule of six" which means that we are unable to hold the AGM for the foreseeable future.

Since March, and the start of the Covid-19 pandemic. life has changed for all of us. 2 metre social distancing, self-isolation, and face masks are just some of the things that we live with on a daily basis.

Butterflies Cafe is closed, and the Guides are not working, so our fundraising has been affected. There have been no guiz nights, no stall on Babbacombe Downs, no collection at Sainsbury and no Bed Push. The Christmas raffle will also be postponed.

This has put back our current project of raising £1.5 million pounds to equip the new planned Emergency Department. Members of the public are trying their best to keep our fundraising continuing. Ladies from Torquay Dance and Exercise Class organised a fundraising session at Ilsham Valley. A group of ramblers walked from Torquay to Brixham at the beginning of September. A lady is walking in remembrance of her late father. Two Brixham schoolgirls also raised money after being inspired by Clap for Carers.

It is with much sadness that we report the passing of Rene Isobel Knight, a long-standing trustee of over 40 years, and member of the St Marychurch district.

Born three months after WW1 ended, she attended school in the North of England until aged 13, when she went to work for Woolworths. At the start of WW2, she joined the WRAF, and worked in the communications and telegraph unit Bletchley Park. After a few years Rene moved to London where she joined the staff at Guy's Hospital and got the bug of helping the League of Friends. When she retired, she moved to Devon and that's where her association with Torbay Hospital League of Friends began.

For many years, Rene could be seen in St Marychurch precinct selling items for the League. She also enjoyed

helping out at the Rotary day on Babbacombe Downs and at the Garden Parties at the Palace Hotel. Until a few years ago she would carry a couple of carrier bags full of paperbacks across the road to a local hotel, where she would sell them to the new quests.

She will be sadly missed by all who knew her.

# Walking on Water

A group of local ramblers decided to let their feet do the walking in aid of Torbay Hospital League of Friends.

The group followed the coastal path from Torquay harbourside to Brixham Harbour - a distance of about eight and a half miles. The walk was the brainchild of Street Pastor Bill Becher and his wife Maralyn who are both keen walkers with a long affiliation with the South Devon Ramblers.

Bill said: 'We were inspired by the example of Reverend Jerry Cook - known as the "Rambling Rev"- and his sponsored walks for local causes.

'And with the NHS very much in the spotlight, we felt the time was right for a fundraiser in aid of the Torbay Hospital League of Friends.'

He added: 'We both worked at Torbay Hospital when we were first married. I am a volunteer on the Torbay Hospital Chaplaincy Team and a Torbay Street Pastor.



# Comfort Packs

Torbay Hospital League of Friends paid £2336 to provide 400 Comfort Packs to patients who were unlucky enough to have been admitted to Hospital after the Coronavirus pandemic meant that, for a time at least, no visitors were allowed so that some patients had no personal effects with them on admission.

Each pack included various items of personal toiletries including toothpaste, hand wipes, hand

cream etc, note paper and a puzzle book. The items in each pack were kindly supplied by WHSmith at cost price and a team from the hospital duly made them up prior to distribution to those patients who needed them.

Dr Jo Sykes, Consultant in charge of the distribution said "We are very grateful to the League of Friends for agreeing to pay for these packs which have made such a difference to patients who suddenly found themselves in hospital with no personal effects and no immediate prospects of receiving visitors who would normally bring such items in for them. All the patients who have received a pack have been delighted and so far, we have distributed about 200 and continue to give them out to all patients who need them. "

Kathryn Westaway, Chairman of the League of Friends said "We were so pleased when the opportunity arose early in the lockdown period to have been able to provide these items to patients in the hope that they would make the first few days in hospital easier and a little bit more comfortable. We are very much looking forward to the time when all restrictions are lifted so we shall be able to contribute much more to help all patients in Torbay Hospital"

## A Lovely Move for Two Local Charities

A Torquay-based dance and exercise class have donated cheques for a total of £240 in memory of one of their most popular members.

I became Secretary in 2002 and am only the 4th since the League was started in 1952.

I followed my fellow Solicitor Alan Brookes as his retirement followed my term as Chairman, so the change of office was relatively painless for all concerned. There has been a complete sea change in the overall administration of the League over the last few years to reflect all the changes and comply with an ever-increasing number of rules and regulations - risk assessments and policies abound all over the place. Somehow, although the activities of the League have diminished (we no longer have an Annual Garden Party, supply telephones for in patients, nor run our own Transport etc.) the admin side seems as busy as ever. On the other hand, the money we now give to the hospital has also increased exponentially. In the old days a "big" gift was a few thousand pounds whereas now it is over a £1m - and we have done this four times during my time as Secretary with another £1m gift currently in the pipeline.

There is no doubt that the League punches well above its weight and long may that continue.

#### **Chief Nurse**

The hospital delighted to announce the appointment of Deborah Kelly who is our new Chief Nurse.

Following a thorough recruitment process and a number of very strong candidates, Deborah joined the Trust as Chief Nurse on 1 August 2020.

The role has an especially key part to play now as the Trust continues its ground-breaking progress in providing integrated seamless, high-quality care to its communities - from hospital to home and beyond.

Deborah has recently returned from the Middle East, where she was Deputy Chief Nurse and Chief Nurse for Informatics at Sidra Medicine, Doha Qatar. An experienced nurse, she has previously held board level posts in the NHS and was Deputy Chief Nurse for Barts Health NHS Trust from 2014 to 2017.

#### **Chief Finance Officer**

The Trust has been awarded £15m of external funding to improve urgent and emergency care. We have commenced the initial building works in the emergency department (ED), lasting until end November. The ED has become increasingly busy and crowded over recent years, and the COVID-19 pandemic this year has provided a huge challenge in an already small department around ensuring people are safe and can socially distance. The building work alters the department to ensure we can safely treat patients whilst at the same time implementing safety measures associated with infection control and COVID-19. There will then be further building works in ED in the new year to further improve the department and enable better patient flow and care.

We are also building a new medical receiving unit (MRU) using a modular build for patients who have medical needs and require urgent assessment and treatment. Some will be treated same day and not require hospital admission, whilst some may need admitting into a bed for a couple of days. Historically these patients would have attended ED, adding to the crowding problem and have had long waits to be seen and treated. The MRU will be 2 storeys with direct ambulance access – patients will be able to directly access the right place to get the right treatment straight away. We hope the MRU will open in March/April dependent upon the plans and development.



As ever, we are grateful for the League's support, and we are looking forward to welcoming committee members on a walk-through of the proposed development in the coming weeks so that we can bring to life the clinical model.

#### **Junior League of Friends**

On behalf of the Junior League of Friends team from Torquay Girls Grammar school, I can honestly say how much of a privilege it has been being part of this fantastic charity organisation; we have enjoyed every second and the fundraising events we have held to raise money for Torbay Hospital.

As we near the end of our time before we hand over to the new team, we look back on the years achievements... by setting up cake sales and refreshment stands at parents evenings and open evenings, the Junior team has raised an impressive £267.98 so far!

Despite the Coronavirus pandemic and the lack of opportunity for fundraising that this has resulted in, we are still hoping for one last push to raise money by allowing the sixth form students to participate in 'Freestyle Friday', where they won't be asked to wear uniform. Participation in this will require a small donation, which will be split at the end between various charities, one of which we are hoping to be for the League of Friends.

# Walking for William

The daughter of a prolific Devon poet who passed away from heart failure is paying tribute to his memory by walking the South West Coast.

William Oxley was a popular member of the Torbay community and an internationally-respected writer, published throughout the world in magazines and journals such as The New York Times and The Spectator. Originally born in Manchester, William moved to Brixham in 1976.

He suffered from rheumatic fever as a child, which damaged his heart, and he was told that he might not live past the age of forty.

However, William went on to live a full life, writing numerous books, poems and becoming the poet laureate for Torbay in 2000. Sadly on February, 4th, 2020, at the age of 80, he passed away.

His daughter Kate Hurd, has now walked one of her dad's favourite routes in his memory and as a tribute to the medical staff who helped care for him.

On Saturday, October 10, she set out following the South West Coastal path from Hope's Nose, Kate covered a distance of approximately 32 miles and finished at Goodrington beach.

Kate, who lives in Paignton, underwent a hip replacement just a couple of years ago. She is hoping the challenge will be a fitting tribute to her father after Covid restrictions meant that a more formal memorial couldn't take place. She said: "It's given everyone a point of focus. He was a real gentleman, a very kind person. He'd talk to anyone, he was a very generous individual."

She said she had been practising the walk and making good progress with her hip, Kate said: "It's been a bit of a crazy ride because two and a half years ago I couldn't even walk. Back at the start of April, I found three miles tough."

Kate did not undertake the walk alone but her mother Patricia, joined her for small sections of the walk
