From the Hospital Better health and care for all

I am delighted to have the opportunity to provide a short update for your newsletter and would like to start by saying a sincere and heartfelt thank you for all the support you continue to give us, the amazing fundraising that you do and for the interest and kindness you show us.

As I sit here writing this, the sun is out, and I can see daffodils waving in the breeze. I truly hope that the signs of spring and the hope and renewal that they bring will be felt by all of us. It's been an extremely challenging two years for each and every one of us and the pandemic is not over yet.

Some of you may be aware that we currently have more people with COVID-19 in our hospitals than at any time during the pandemic. While it is encouraging that the majority of patients are in hospital for other conditions and are asymptomatic or experiencing mild symptoms, the impact that the presence of COVID has in our hospitals is really significant.



Under current infection prevention and control guidelines, one patient testing positive for COVID-19 can result in the closure of the whole ward, meaning that beds are unavailable for emergency admissions and for planned operations. This means people waiting longer for treatment in the community and operations being cancelled or postponed and long waits in Emergency Departments for people needing a hospital bed.

The pandemic has not only increased the pressure across all aspects of health and social care services but has had a significant impact on the most vulnerable people in our communities and the inequality gap has quickly widened. This is why it was really important to us that we refresh our organisational strategy and set a clear vision for better health and care for all. Our strategy has at its heart core principles of the strategy we developed with local partners in 2005 and builds on the last seventeen years of experience and learning. The refreshed strategy was approved by our Board of Directors in January and is now available on our website: https://www.torbayandsouthdevon.nhs. uk/about-us/our-vision-and-strategy/

As I write this, the challenges that we are experiencing in our organisation, across our Devon Integrated Care System and in our communities, could not be more starkly felt. Put simply COVID-19 has made the work we do harder. The world has changed, and we need to change how we work and how we work together in order to provide better health and care to all.

For us, this means that our older people have greater needs, as a result of the social restrictions, fear of leaving their homes, lack of social interaction and delays in receiving care. By focusing on delivering more care to people in their own homes and communities, designed around what matters to them, we will be able to help people to maintain their independence while delivering care to more people. We have an exciting pilot taking place in our breast care unit where we are using a mixed reality headset to support nurse-led dressing clinics in the community. Clinical nurse specialists use the headset to send a high-resolution video feed to consultants, in real time, to get immediate feedback and advice on a patient's needs.



Our most vulnerable children are waiting longer to receive specialist services and our transformation of clinical pathways for our children and family health services could not be more important. Our team on Louisa Cary ward are doing fantastic work to improve the hospital experience of children and young people who have neurodiversity or experience emotional distress. They have improved the availability of equipment and aids including weighted blankets, a 'magic carpet' interactive floor projector and other audio visual, tactile and sensory equipment.

Waiting times for specialist hospital services have deteriorated at speed due to the need to prioritise immediate care for patients with COVID-19 and urgent care. Our planned care services are critically important in keeping people healthy and supporting them to live well. We need to re-design the way we deliver these services, with our partners across Devon, to reduce waiting times and improve the experience and outcomes for our local people, and we need to do this quickly. We are using the Nightingale Hospital in Exeter to reduce the waiting times for MRI and CT scans and just this month we began to offer people hip, knee and other orthopaedic surgery at the Nightingale too.

There are exciting developments in our future too as we use the monies that we plan for how best to use the monies we will receive from the Government's health infrastructure plan (new hospital programme) to build new hospital facilities, supported by local health and wellbeing centres and home-based care, making the most of digital technology to build a brighter future for everyone.

Our strategy describes our vision for the future, why it matters to us and our local communities, what this means for the way we run our services and how we will work together to deliver it. We hope you feel that through your work with the League of Friends you are actively contributing to our vision of better health and care for all and we look forward to continuing to work together to support everyone to live as well as possible.
