Dear League of Friends,

When I started drafting this introduction, I was expecting it would be a valedictory statement from me as Trust Chairman as my current contract expires at the end of May.

Responding to advice from NHS England regarding the need for continuity of leadership during the difficulties Devon health and social care services are currently facing, our Governors have decided exceptionally to offer me a further 12 month contract. I'm really grateful to them for this flexibility – it didn't feel to be a good time to be leaving the Trust with so much change happening.

Much of that change is already known to the League of Friends because you have been in the background providing essential and valuable support throughout. The new Acute Medical Unit is a good example. It was a privilege to acknowledge what you do at the opening ceremony. Since then, the AMU has already started proving it's worth, and it is the most recent and tangible example of the changes to our acute site that are gathering momentum as the Building a Brighter Future project gets underway. I think that change of this sort will be the flavour of the next few years, and of course it is hoped that you will be involved and supportive of requirements that can't be achieved through public funds as things develop.

It was a real joy to be at the "official opening" of the League's office space in the hospital main entrance. Since I'm working at regaining fitness for a summer of cycling, the only down side was having to repeatedly refuse the excellent cake on offer. It is a significant step forwards to have the League back with a permanent footprint in the hospital and I hope will mean that we can continue to raise profile of the League with the public we serve.

It's been and remains a very challenging period. Recovering from the implications of the pandemic and managing a reality where demand and capacity are out of balance is hard. Your support and understanding means a very great deal to our staff, who continue to provide the exceptional, day in, day out. Knowing that the League are there, helping and appreciating what they do is so very important for them. I offer heartfelt thanks on their behalf.

Torbay Hospital League of Friends has generously paid out £39,000.

To enable our Phlebotomists and Drs Assistants to replace old and worn-out trolleys.

The services cover the wards at Torbay hospital 7 days a week both weekdays and out of hours until midnight.

Michelle Collins from Site Services made a bid to the League of Friends in July last year to replace the old, bulky, unwieldy trolleys with new ones. Michelle told the League "The old trolleys were heavy, bulky and were not really compatible with the work load the team currently face especially as the label printers they use were not compatible with the laptop/software and often caused delays in printing cyberlab labels at the bedside". Michelle asked the League to fund 10 new trolleys along with monitors/keyboards and blood printing labels. She said "These new trolleys are easier to move, have powered label printers to increase performance of the team across the hospital. They have larger monitors, to ensure the correct information for samples are taken".

Chairman of the League, Roy Tuttle, said Michelle's presentation to the League was very persuasive. He said "We understood only too well there were issues with equipment not working or not compatible and that blood samples and label printing should all be completed at the bedside. For all these reasons we were happy to spend the money as we know this would be an invaluable investment for the team and the hospital".





Update from Chief Executive

I am delighted to have been invited to provide a short update for your newsletter and would like to start by saying how wonderful it is to see the new League of Friends office open on level 4 in our main entrance. It is really important to us that the League has a permanent, visible presence on site and that we support you to raise awareness of your very valuable work.

I was privileged to join you at your first official event of 2023, the quiz night at the Horizon Centre. While sadly I was not part of the winning team, losing out to my more knowledgeable non-executive and executive colleagues, it was a highly enjoyable evening and great to be able to be today again.

It has been a tough winter for the NHS nationally, regionally and locally but there have been many positives. Our Acute Medical Unit, to which you generously donated more than half a million pounds of equipment, has helped us to reduce ambulance handover delays and ensure more people are getting the right care in the right place. Good work is taking place to reduce waiting lists although there is much more to do – the expansion of our endoscopy and day theatres provision will make a significant difference and we are looking forward to these building works being completed by the end of this year.

Some of you may have also noticed that the Hengrave car park has become a building compound while we expand our radiotherapy department so that we can install a new Radiation Therapy Computed Tomography (RT-CT) scanner.



The scanner will bring state of the art technology to our radiotherapy department offeringa better patient experience and create a more comfortable environment and it is hoped it will be in use by September. We have also begun the first of many changes planned on site as enabling works for our New Hospital Programme get underway. Northcott Hall at the top of our site is being removed in order to make space for the site compound for the building work to expand endoscopy and day theatres reducing the need to use car parking spaces for this purpose which is very important! Built in the 1960s Northcott Hall was used for many years as nurse's accommodation although more recently it has stood vacant.

Further changes are planned on both the South and North part of the site to ensure that we are fully prepared and ready to start building our new hospital buildings as soon as we can, enabling us to continue delivering the best care possible to our patients. We expect an announcement from the national team on our funding allocation in the next few weeks (fingers crossed!).

It feels fitting that in the year that the NHS turns 75 that we continue the legacy of innovation and improvement that has been part of the NHS since its founding. The health and wellbeing needs of our people have changed radically in the past 75 years and it is only right and fitting that the NHS changes to meet the needs of people now and in the future. You have played a vital role in our past and we truly hope that you will continue to play a vital role in our future. Together we can trulymake a difference.

We are very lucky to have such a dedicated, supportive and enthusiastic group of people who all want to help us make a difference whether that is to the care we can provide to people who use our services, the experience of receiving or delivering care or to the physical environment in which people work or receive care.

We hope you feel that through your work with the League of Friends you are actively contributing to our vision of better health and care for all and we look forward to continuing to work together with you to support everyone to live as well as possible.
