£2.1m to Torbay Hospital

from the League of Friends



The League of Friends is about to pay a total of £2.1m to Torbay Hospital on new equipment including £566.000 for vital clinical and medical items for the Acute Medical Unit shortly to open on Level 2, as well as providing £1.3m for two new Scanners for Radiology, a further £89.751.00 for Computers for use in Wards throughout the hospital, a Ventilator for the Emergency Department, Dementia equipment for the Care of the Elderly wards, various equipment for the Post Anaesthesia Care Unit and a host of other items which will enhance Medical and Patient care.

When the National Health Service started in July 1948 all previous voluntary help for Torbay hospital disappeared and so the Torbay Hospital League of Friends was formed. Over the last

The Chairman of the League, Roy Tuttle said "Our motto is "Helping to Care" so I am delighted to announce that during the course of the last 12 months we have been able to promise further funding to Torbay Hospital to the extent of just over £2.1m. This huge amount of money is down to the incredible generosity of the people living in Torbay who have continued to support us wholeheartedly in spite of Covid-19 and lockdowns."

It is more than likely that anyone who has had anything to do with our hospital either personally or through a relative or friend, has benefited from something the League has provided. Because they are all volunteers. The League of Friends is proud to be able to say that on average for every £1 donated 95p is spent on the hospital - a fantastic achievement.

Roy Tuttle went on to say "We are continuing to fund raise and hope to be out and about much more in the future than in the last two years so if you see us rattling a tin or see one of our collecting boxes please give generously."

Message from the Chairman

We continue to operate in Challenging times but I'm very positive for the future of Torbay Hospital and It's League of Friends As you are probably aware the charity is 68 years old and has donated over £21.8 million to our hospital.

We have recently approved bids for hospital equipment totalling £2 million.

The new equipment includes a radiotherapy scanner, a CT diagnostic scanner, equipment for the Acute Medical Unit, a Hamilton T1 ventilator, 3 TVs for trauma orthopaedic ward, mobile diagnostic monitors, trolley's, printers, and keyboards. Brest screening equipment - including an ultrasound machine, imaging workstation, bariatric couch, and a Xion Endoflex System.

Our events team attended the Festival of Fun at Babbacombe Downs in September.

We raised over £300 and met some of our members, supporters and hospital staff.

We are planning a skittles evening in November.


From Mr P White, Secretary

Supporting us to deliver better health and care for all

I am delighted to have been invited to provide a short update for your newsletter and would like to start by thanking you all for the tremendous support you have given us in the 68 years since the Torbay Hospital League of Friends was founded and that you continue to provide.

Over the years you have become one of the most successful Leagues in the country raising millions of pounds and we are deeply grateful for everything you do.

We are very lucky to have such a dedicated, supportive and enthusiastic group of people who all want to help us make a difference whether that is to the care we can provide to people who use our services, the experience of receiving or delivering care or to the physical environment in which people work or receive care.



It was only the other day that I was privileged to join in discussions where you agreed to fund £1.8million of equipment, including two CT scanners as well as items for our new Acute Medical Unit which is due to open this winter. This is an amazing contribution that will make a significant difference and we are truly thankful.

As you know, our vision for better health and care for all has never been more important. We have extremely high levels of deprivation in both our coastal and inland communities and the continuing pandemic has further increased the gap in health inequalities. The current cost of living crisis will make this a very difficult winter for many of our most vulnerable people and will have a further negative impact on their health and wellbeing.

We are already planning for winter in our hospitals and our community and adult social care services. While we currently have very low numbers of people with COVID-19 in our hospitals we are expecting further waves as we move into autumn and winter. The early indications are that the impact of flu will be significant this year and we will be doing everything we can to encourage those who are eligible for the flu jab and the COVID-19 booster (including our own staff) to get vaccinated.

We want to keep as many of our planned care services, including diagnostics and surgery, running as possible over the winter. We will continue to offer local people treatment and care at the Nightingale Hospital in Exeter where this is appropriate for their needs while maintaining our day surgery in Torbay.

I am pleased to share with you that a mobile endoscopy unit has just been installed on the Torbay Hospital site which will help us tackle our waiting lists in this key area while building work starts in the new year on a fourth endoscopy room (and training facilities).



We know that we cannot solve the challenges facing our people and communities alone and by working together with individuals, groups and organisations, such as yourselves, we can do more to help people to live well. Over the past year, your donations have made a huge difference, providing equipment that has helped delivered better care and improved patient experience. By funding training equipment, you have helped our dedicated staff develop and learn, practice new techniques and provide better care.

I also want to give a special mention to the cook and eat sessions you have funded for children and young people living with diabetes – this is a wonderful way to support them to learn key life skills that will help them live well with this challenging long-term condition.

We hope you feel that through your work with the League of Friends you are actively contributing to our vision of better health and care for all and we look forward to continuing to work together with you to support everyone to live as well as possible.
