As always, I need to offer my sincere thanks to the members of the Torbay Hospital League of Friends for their support, and of course for the generosity of those who have given donations and raised money for the League.

The League have generously agreed to support our Endoscopy department, with whom they have had an association for 20 years, in acquiring the next generation of high-tech equipment. This will allow the teams to serve the population of Torbay and South Devon, to make diagnoses earlier and to improve outcomes for patients.

In addition to that major donation the League has continued to support departments throughout the hospital in improving their equipment and the environment for patients using our services. This is particularly welcome as we are in a long phase of austerity which shows no sign of being relaxed.

We are very proud of the services and the care that we offer to our patients and our staff continue to go the extra mile to ensure that care is safeguarded. However it is becoming increasingly difficult to sustain that outstanding care and the support of the League is crucial.

The Trust has had a difficult time over the last 12 months. We entered the present financial year with a requirement to save £40 million to balance the books and maintain our financial independence. That is 10% of our annual turnover and it seemed an almost impossible task. However, through innovation and some considerable pain, we look likely to get very close to that savings target.

We will not achieve that without reduction in the quality and/or timeliness of service to patients and we are grateful for the patience of our service users.

We know also that we have a similar mountain to climb in the next financial year.

There is an appreciation by the Trust Board that we have to generate income and reduce our costs by a more radical approach in the coming year.

The support of the League of Friends has never been more important. We would not have been able to fund some of the equipment and improvements to the environment in our ageing buildings without the League. Once again we are very grateful to all those who support the League and urge you to continue to do so in the coming year.
